All students did an excellent job and they should be so proud of their efforts. Well done to all students who competed in this years Yarram Eisteddfod.








SENIOR BOYS & GIRLS BASKETBALL

Working in teams of seven students from Years 7-10, all 28 students have been training throughout Term 2 and have six weeks to prepare a 10 minute interpretation that solves (answers) to a Long Term Challenge. Teams will also be given a Spontaneous Challenge on the day to prepare and present, they are then scored for both. Winners of the regional round on Saturday 24th August will go through to the State Final at La Trobe University on Sunday 8th September.

THE TEAMS

Teams of seven students from school entry to Year 10 are invited to participate within two divisions:

Teams in the Primary Division must be a mix of students from at least two year levels with a maximum of four students from any one year.

Teams in the Secondary Division must be a mix of students from at least two year levels (up to and including Year 10) with a minimum of two students from Year 7, and a maximum of four students from any one year.

A mixed primary and secondary team (Middle School) may compete in the Secondary division.

THE TOURNAMENTS

The Regional Tournaments will be held late August 2019 at three metropolitan and four regional venues. The winning teams from all Victorian Regions, in each division of each Challenge, will be invited to participate in the Victorian Branch Final, to be held on Sunday 8th September at La Trobe University, Bundoora.

The eight winning teams from the Branch Final will be invited to participate in the Inaugural TOM International Final (TIF) where they will compete against other Australian and International teams.

SPARK SCIENCE CAMP

In the Term 2 holidays, Year 9 student Xannon Taylor Le-Page attended the Melbourne University SPARK Camp. For the second week of the break, he joined 60, Year 10 and 11 students from all over Australia who gathered for a five day camp full of great experiences. The students were housed at Trinity College and enjoyed dining together in the historical accommodation on the Universities grounds.

The week saw the group visit RMIT, Monash, Victoria and Melbourne Universities Science Departments where they met with people such as the Toyota Engineering Design Team and had a presentation from the Australian Defence Force where they had a good look at the work opportunities where Science and Engineering could take them into the future.

The teams were able to build model aircraft, an at sea Radio Tower, FM radio transmitters and visit buildings like the Rialto Tower. Xannon found the week exciting and inspiring, and met and made new friends with like-minded students. He came away so pleased that he was given the opportunity to go.


