# This Weeks Prayer

The church season of Lent begins next week. Lent is the time of preparation for Easter, the key event of the whole of Christianity. We will celebrate Mass as a College on Ash Wednesday, 26 February. Parents and families are welcome to join us for the Mass, which includes the distribution of the ashes, where each person has the sign of the cross marked on their forehead. When we wear the ashes like this for the day we are taking part in a tradition that reaches back thousands of years. The ashes are the ancient symbol of repentance and purification, they are the outward sign of our inner intention to set aside the things that keep us from God and try to be better people.

The school year is well and truly running now and we have already had a number of key whole school events.

Last week saw our Opening Mass and Commissioning Presentation held at the College followed by the Swimming Sports at Korumburra. It was great to see so many parents and friends come along to support our students at both these events. Our 2020 College Captains, Joshua Wright and Lilly Worsfold have spent 5 days in Sydney with Mr Maskell along with 80 students from Josephite schools in Australia and New Zealand who are gathered for the Annual JJAMM (Joseph, Julian and Mary MacKillop) Student Leadership Conference.

In the past two weeks all of our Junior School Students have completed assessments using the VCAA OnDemand Tests. This will provide our teaching staff with valuable information for where each student is at in their learning journey and what they are ready to learn. The data will be used by teachers to ensure we plan for accelerated rate of progression for each student in literacy and numeracy.

In a busy world, SIMON provides you with realtime updates on your child's attendance and learning progress as well as detailed reporting to keep you informed. You can access this information through the Parent Access Module (PAM). Please ensure your PAM account is active and the medical details have been completed. In the near future we will be transitioning towards using PAM for our permission forms for excursions and other school activities.

#### LEARNING FRAMEWORK @ MARY MACKILLOP COLLEGE

#### FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL CATHOLIC IDENTITY AND MISSION



Please read this as preparation for Ash Wednesday. This year we celebrate Ash Wednesday on February 26. The College will celebrate a Mass in Pioneer Hall.

Years 7 and 9 will celebrate a special liturgy on their respective Camps.

The tradition of marking the forehead with ash on Ash Wednesday can be traced back to the ancient Jewish action of dusting oneself with ash as a sign of repentance and mourning for wrongful actions. It was a public declaration of the acknowledgement of the wrong and the commitment to turn one's life around and try not to make the same mistake again. It remains a public declaration that during the period of Lent those who wear the cross of ash are going to attempt to turn around their lives and re-focus themselves more fully on God.

Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of blessing ashes made from palm branches blessed on the previous year's Palm Sunday and placing them on the heads of participants to the accompaniment of the words "Repent, and believe in the Gospel". The ashes we will receive are a reminder of the simpleness of life. As you are marked with these ashes, we remember that we are not perfect. The cross on our forehead reminds us that we have sinned.

#### AMBULANCE MEMBERS

# 2020 SCHOOL FEES

The 2020 School Fees for Mary MacKillop Catholic College have been approved by the DOSCEL Board.

The School Fees for 2020 are:

Discounts will continue to apply to the tuition fee component as per the College School Fee Policy. The Capital Levy is a per family compulsory fee to assist with the ongoing capital requirements of the College.
